

Osteoporosis and Low Bone Density in the United States

The chart below represents the estimated number of women and men aged fifty and older in the United States who have or are at high risk for developing osteoporosis due to low bone density. Prevalence estimates are based on 2000 Census data and are presented for the year 2002, 2010 and 2020. The source of the prevalence data is America's Bone Health: The State of Osteoporosis and Low Bone Mass In Our Nation, a publication of the National Osteoporosis Foundation.
